Bethel Bell February 2022 Pastor's Page

As I write this article we have had one Sunday without singing or coffee hour. I am as tired of these protocols as you are. I wish we hadn't felt the need to make these decisions that make it seem like we are taking steps back rather than moving forward through this pandemic. But the truth is, we are still in a pandemic, and we always knew we might need to make adjustments.

I am hoping, with all of you, that there is light beginning to glimmer at the end of this long tunnel. I hope that this latest variant and broader vaccinations will help the larger population get to a reasonable amount of immunity so that we can treat this virus like any other cold or flu. But there are still people at risk. Our youngest children and those who are not vaccinated (for a variety of reasons) can still be hospitalized and have long-term effects if they catch COVID. And so, we must be vigilant for a while longer. In our Wednesday Bible study we are looking at Isaiah, when the word from God is that things are going to be difficult for Israel. The prophet asks, "How long, O Lord?" not so much wanting a timeline but to indicate that God is being unfair about the suffering and the exile from their homeland.

This virus seems unfair. Our medical and science experts seem unfair. God's response to the prophet's question, "How long?" is basically, until all that needs to be eliminated and terminated is at an end. I don't think that's exactly how pandemics work, but there will come an end to the vigilance we must keep. Until then, we must wait and keep up with the procedures that will help as many people as possible stay safe and alive.

In the meantime, we can still gather, we can still glorify God in our worship, we can still pray and give thanks for God's continued love and care for us. And if we start to feel sorry for ourselves and disappointed that we can't do everything we want to do in the ways we want to do them, perhaps we can look at those who are still worshiping at home because they have a medical condition they may never fully recover from. We can appreciate the struggles of those who are in chronic pain or who have lost the freedom to move about as they please because of age or disability.

Time still marches on and we <u>are</u> moving forward through the pandemic, maybe just a little more cautiously these days. The music will return. Coffee and cookies will return. Let us face this time with courage that God is leading us forward and that we are being changed for God's good purposes along the way.

Council Focus for 2022

Our day together started at 9:00 am with retreat session focused on developing the focus of our council for the coming year. After spending time in small groups and facilitated discussion lead by Pastor Lynne, the council mission statement that will guide us in our work will be:

As the council of Bethel we will fearlessly follow God's leading, respect and encourage one another, listen to and communicate with the congregation.

Agreement that we would include this mission statement on all council agendas for the coming year and our devotion for next month is based on this statement.

After developing our council mission statement, Board meeting breakout sessions started at 10:10.

Reconvened for council meeting at 11:00.

Meeting minutes approval

Meeting minutes will be distributed to board members by the secretary via email following the council meeting. Everyone should review the minutes and provide any changes to the secretary that are found. The goal is to have approved minutes to include in the Bethel Bell at the end of the month. December meeting minutes were approved by the board in December and published in the January Bethel Bell.

Treasurer's Report (Chris Kast)

Chris shared summary of income and expenses, both for December and YTD thru December.

It was noted that open staff positions contributed considerably to the difference between the income and expense figures thru December.

Board of Trustees (Jack Graves) The roles and responsibilities for the board of trustees will be: VP – Jack Graves, Financial – Ken Coats, Property – John Sarver, Building – Terry Smith, Stewardship – Chad McCabe

Heat Pump Update

4 Contractors were contacted to provide quotes for heat pump replacement

Tri-Tech heating proposal to replace the heat pump system servicing the sanctuary is recommended based on: Provided timely and complete quote

Was able to provide a quote that met current county and PUD energy requirements, with a system that would be more cost effective for Bethel in the long run as well

Lowest cost proposal

Total cost (including tax) - \$37,318.05

Would need to pay 1/3 down upon authorization, balance due upon completion

Discussion about project and funding.

The annual budget included \$30k for the heat pump system to be addressed.

There is additional \$15k in the line item for other (annual) building and grounds expenses. Depending on expenses this year in that line item, some funding could be used for this project.

January Retreat & Council Meeting (cont) January 15, 2022



Was shared that there may be additional funding provided anonymously for this church expense if needed.

Recommendation from the Board of Trustees to the Council to approve the Tri-Tech bid and authorize John S. / Trustees to move ahead with authorizing the work.

During discussion the question was raised about whether or not this proposal would provide separate heating / cooling zones (controls) for the sanctuary and Rocksolid. Currently the way the system works is that to heat / cool the sanctuary you heat / cool Rocksolid at the same time. The reverse is also true – heating / cooling Rocksolid will heat / cool the sanctuary. Current proposal does NOT include this option due to increased costs it would bring, though the estimate to split the two areas was provided. Additional cost of \$8k would be added to current quote to provide separate zone controls for RockSolid and the sanctuary. Following a discussion about the long term advantages – especially the energy saving we hope to see by reducing the cost spent heating/cooling the sanctuary which is the largest cubic space in the building - and funding possibilities, it was agreed that adding this option was the preferred way to go.

Jan Sayler motioned to approve Tri-Tech bid with additional \$8k added to original quote to cover separate zone controls for the sanctuary and RockSolid. Total quote approval of \$45,318.05. MSA

Follow-up steps -

Ken S. to discuss with anonymous donor getting commitment of support in writing and amount willing to provide – possibly up to \$15k. Letter to be shared with Pastor so at least one other person has knowledge of commitment. Ken and John to discuss with Marcy if RockSolid could possibly help to cover the cost of the additional feature.

Requested update from Deacons on whether or not there would be a noisy offering on January 30th (the fifth Sunday). Confirmed that there would not be a noisy offering this month. Souper Bowl of Caring will be right around the corner and want to encourage members to support that outreach program.

Chris is still working with On Line Support to get a final quote for hardware to update the church's wi-fi system. Will be reviewing final hardware and tech support quotes at a future meeting.

Annual financial review is being scheduled soon.

Discussed the need to coordinate with Pastor Lynne on how to support her trip to the Holy Land through fundraising options.

Board of Deacons (Jan Sayler)

The roles and responsibilities for the board of deacons will be:

VP – Jan Sayler, Church Service Team – Jim Fuerstenberg, Worship & Music – Nancy Fuerstenberg, Evangelism – Candi Ehrich, Fellowship – Erika Stauffer

An increase in COVID infection rates have interrupted activities again at the church. Beginning this Sunday (January 16) there will be no singing – by the worship team or congregation. Infection rates and recommendations that are received will determine when we can begin singing and other activities again at the church. Our priority is to keep everyone safe.

Will be doing Lent and Easter planning next month. Lent starts Wednesday, March 2. Planning to have bell choir provide special music during the Easter season.

Board of Education (Linda Bieker)

The roles and responsibilities for the board of education will be:

VP – Linda Bieker, Nursery – Val Moon, Sunday School & Milestone Ministries (excluding Cradle Roll) – Tara McCabe, Cradle Roll – Linda Bieker, Middle / High School Youth – Open, Adult Education – Dottie Davis

Linda shared that Jim Bergren had been a member of the Board of Education, with a term that ran through the calendar year 2022. Jim recently transitioned to a staff role with the Church and has vacated his position on the Board of Education. Per the current language in the Constitution for board vacancies, boards can have 1 open position, so at this time, Jim's position will remain unfilled until the normal council election period later this year. January Retreat & Council Meeting (cont)



Looking for additional volunteers to help cover the nursery. Will be talking with ushers to let them know If there is no one available to cover the nursery on a Sunday, families are welcome to use it as a cry room. Without an attendant available they will need to stay with their children though.

Looking for a volunteer to lead Adult Learning on Sundays.

Family Ministry Report (Bonnie)

Due to increased COVID rates, some families are not attending Sunday School in person currently. An electronic link to the class is being shared with families so children are still able to participate.

Preparing for the Souper Bowl of Caring. Youth will be leading the service on February 13. Canned food donations are requested to support the North Clark County Food Bank. List of items requested is posted on the bulletin board and will be shared through email updates from the church. (See pg 4 of this newsletter)

Pastor's Report (Pr. Lynne)

Shared her plan to take 2 weeks of vacation each year. Not yet finalized but will likely be later in the year, with smaller trips this spring and the trip to the Holy Land in June. Will coordinate with staff and deacons for any coverage needed.

There will be new member classes during Lent. These sessions are open to anyone who wants a refresher as well, not just those who are interested in becoming new members of Bethel. A 1st communion class for younger members will also be taking place during Lent.

Installation of council members will be done at worship Sunday, January 16.

Closing (Ken S.) Ken shared the poem "Heaven's Grocery Store". Closed with the Lord's Prayer. Adjourned at 12:05pm. Respectfully submitted by Teresa Correy
