Pastor's Stuff



This summer I am meeting with each of our church council boards for extended conversation about the life and ministry of Bethel. In June I met with the Trustees, July was with the Board of Education, and this month I will meet with the Deacons. Some of the questions we have been asking include:

“What are you most proud of here at Bethel?”

“If you had unlimited funding or resources, what would you want for Bethel?”

Our conversations have been lively and imaginative so far, and I expect the same with the Deacons. I encourage all of our members to ask themselves these same questions and give your thoughts and ideas to one of our council members.

This year our council adopted their own mission statement which includes a commitment to listen to the congregation and to fearlessly follow God's guidance as we

understand it. God's word for our church may come from one or more of our members so if you have an idea for ministry or a passion to participate in some way, please reach out to our council members to share what God has revealed to you. After the meeting with the Deacons the council will look at all the topics that came up and discern where our attention and effort should focus for either the short-term or long-term, depending on the ideas.

For the past few weeks, our Mid-Week emails have included some devotional reading and contemplation to help each of us reflect on our own callings. If you have scrolled past those, you can find them on page 3 of this newsletter. See what comes up as you talk with your family or friends about how God is calling each of you.

The ministry of Bethel is not only accomplished by our council—which I know you understand fully! But maybe God is calling you into something new. As our lives change, new roles and activities can breathe new enthusiasm for the work God calls us to be about, both in the church and in the world.

This month our gospel readings address how we live as God's people. Jesus says, “Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit...” (Luke 12:35) In order to follow God's call, we need to be ready. When we walk out the door each day, we need to be ready to say yes to the opportunities God will bring us to serve a neighbor or express a word of grace.

It's one thing to hear a calling for us individually and another to hear God's word for us as a congregation. Not every idea or passion will be picked up by the whole, but that doesn't mean you can't follow it on your own! As we prepare for the fall programs to start up again, let's be ready to jump into our disciple callings!

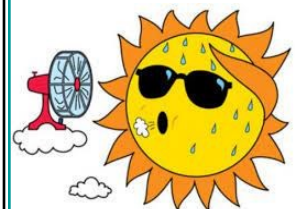

This summer, the council and Bethel staff prayerfully invite you to join us in the ministry of Bethel.

Every member, no matter who you are or what you do, are called to minister to others and make disciples. You could be a nurse, a business owner, a dog groomer, an athlete, a banker, a teacher, a parent, a gardener, or some crazy combination of

several things and you would still have the call by God to serve those around you and tell others about Jesus.

In the July Mid-Week we invited everyone to take a moment each week for four weeks with the following Scripture passages and questions, pondering how you hear God calling you:

1. **1 Samuel 3: 1-10** - God calls Samuel by name. By what name does he call you? What names or roles do you hold that carry a sense of ministry with them? Examples might include Mom/Dad, baker, mechanic, a gardener, an athlete, etc.
2. **1 Kings 19:11-13** - Elijah recognizes God's voice in the whispering wind. *In what ways is God specifically guiding you, and toward what?* You can view a helpful video at this link as well: <https://youtu.be/fVq3DBiYOYw>
3. **Jeremiah 1: 4-10** - Jeremiah protests that he does not know how to speak and is too young. *What protests do you offer when God calls you, and how does God answer them?* We all experience transitions throughout our lives – graduating school, entering young adulthood, starting a new career or job, getting married, becoming a parent or grandparent, entering the empty nest years, retiring, and much more. *What emotions are you feeling – excitement, anticipation, confusion, loss, grief?* Reflect on the experience of your current or most recent life transition.
4. **Luke 1: 26-38** - Mary responds to God's call by saying, "Let it be done to me." *How are you responding, right now, to God's calls?*

Take time to name the reality about your call and passion for ministry. As you evaluate, consider what gives you life, and what drains you. Consider your hopes and fears, dreams and visions—How does your daily life experiences help you discover meaning and purpose in life? Sometimes we discover our calling through experiences of joy and celebration, other times through difficulty, challenge, or loss. What is your story? Let's share our stories together as we continue to discover a loving, merciful, and gracious God who wants to accompany us on our life's journey.

The staff and church council continue to work together to listen to the needs of the congregation and work towards bringing us closer to God and one another. We will follow up in September with more ways to share our stories to continue our journey – finding ways to live out our calling in everyday life.

July Council Meeting

July 12, 2022

Members Present: Linda Bieker, Ken Coats, Teresa Correy, Candi Ehrich, Jim Fuerstenberg, Nancy Fuerstenberg, Jack Graves, Chad McCabe, Tara McCabe, John Sarver, Ken Sayler, Erika Stauffer

Staff Present: Jim Bergren, Pastor Lynne Ogren

Not in Attendance: Dottie Davis, Chris Kast, Val Moon, Terry Smith, Bonnie Stauffer

Meeting called to order at 6:32pm, by Ken.

Meeting opened with a prayer by Pastor Lynne. Ken read our council mission statement and there was discussion about how the council members are working to be 'fearless in following God's leading.

Separated into Boards at 6:42pm.

Attendees reconvened for council meeting at 7:41pm.

Treasurer's Report (Teresa)

Due to extenuating circumstances, monthly reports are not yet available for May and June. Chris was able to get bank statements but has not had time to work with Judy to get a reconciled report for each month. Based on the bank statements our YTD income is \$185k, expenses are \$164k, with a YTD difference of \$20k.

Our goal to work on putting together a Financial Policies and Procedures manual for the church is still in the works. A schedule to complete is not yet finalized.

Board of Trustees (Jack G)

John shared that our new heat pump installation is close to being complete. All the old equipment has been removed. There was a new pad poured, 3 of the 4 air handlers are in and the final one will be installed tomorrow with the heat pump. Anticipate completion on 7/19 with the exception of Energy Recovery Ventilator (ERV) portion that we need to get vents installed for. The ERV system will not prevent the use of air conditioning in the building – including the sanctuary, narthex, and Rock Solid.

Chad is working on a putting together an emergency manual and found some great information through a suggestion shared by the insurance carrier. The trustees will be reviewing it at future meeting.

A community member that is looking for a place to practice his playing has requested to use the piano in the sanctuary. It was agreed that the individual could do so, but would need to fill out the building use form and agree to practice during that times that the office was open already. Judy will work to finalize that schedule with the individual.

Board of Deacons (Candi)

July 31 will be a fifth Sunday, and the noisy offering that day will go to LCS and their efforts to support Afghan and Ukrainian refugees.

Had originally planned to have processional style of communion the first Sunday each month starting in July, but due to travel and health concerns it was decided to move the start date to September. Prepackaged elements will continue to be used on other Sundays.

Rocksolid is celebrating its 20th Anniversary this year. There will be a ribbon cutting on September 9 with an open house. We will be celebrating Sunday, September 25 with Bethel members during and following our regular Sunday service.

September 18 at 2pm we will be inviting the community to come, meet Pastor Lynne, and hear about the trip she and Eric took through the Holy Land. Plans are in the works to provide traditional Israeli foods during the event.

August 28, we will have Lasana Kanneh performed during worship on August 28, with a stipend to be provided in lieu of a free will offering that would be encouraged if it was a separate hosted performance.

The planning is underway for the Bethel Bazaar to be hosted again for the first time since fall 2019.

Board of Education (Linda B)

Vacation Bible School took place at the end of June. Sunday Adult and Youth education classes are on a break until September.

We are still in need of volunteers for the nursery. If anyone has a Smart TV that could be donated to the nursery so the Sunday service can be streamed for the volunteer, please let Linda know.

(July minutes contd.)

The Board of Ed met with Pastor Lynne on July 8. It was a good meeting.

Family Ministry Report (written report)

Vacation Bible School was held June 27 – 30, with 25 youth attending. VBS depends on the support of many to prepare for this amazing ministry – thanks to all who came to the work party, donated supplies, and volunteered to support this event in any way (before, during, or after the event).

Bonnie and Tara will be meeting to prepare for the 22-23 Sunday school year.

Pastor's Report (Pr. Lynne)

The trip to Israel was amazing! Both Eric and Pr. Lynne truly enjoyed their time learning more about the life of Jesus and are excited to share more about their trip at the September 18 event.

Met with Board of Education and Trustees, the Deacons will be meeting in August. A summary of all board meetings will be provided for discernment making plans for the future of Bethel.

There have been inquiries and discussion about restarting the Wednesday evening gatherings. Considering an intergenerational style of teaching and learning together during these Wednesday evenings.

John Sarver was recognized for his work on maintenance of the grounds and the HVAC system.

P. Lynne challenged all of us to think more about how we can 'invite' others to join us and be disciples of this important work. Instead of assigning a task or jumping to do it ourselves. The Time and Talents document that is used during the ministry fair was passed out to the board VPs. It was asked that all VPs review the tasks that are included to update as needed so members will know what types of support is needed.

Other Business

It was proposed that instead of printing the complete minutes in the Bethel Bell, we would publish the 'highlights' in the Bell and include a link to the complete minutes. By doing so, members would be able to easily see what the most important information was the board wants to share but still be able to read the complete details if they wanted to do so. We will begin doing so with the August minutes that are published in the September Bell. We will be trying to keep it between 3-5 highlights each month, but there will always be a link to the complete minutes.

COVID-19 cases are on the rise in Clark County. There was a discussion about any consideration to changes we might want to make to current guidelines. It was agreed that Bethel will continue to follow the county health recommendations for COVID-19, with masks being encouraged but optional. We encourage all members to do what is best for their family and their health.

Closing (Ken)

Next meeting will be August 9th.

MSA to adjourn at 8:40pm.

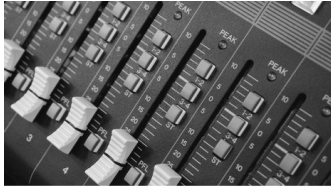

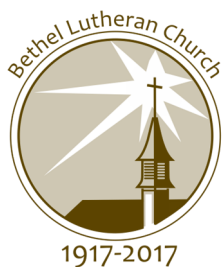
