Pastor's Page

Early in January, we had a gospel reading in which a couple of John the Baptist's disciples wanted to spend time with Jesus and he asked them, "What are you looking for?" They said they wanted to know where he was staying. Jesus replied, "Come and see."

Over these past weeks we have sung these words as our gospel acclamation. As we move into Lent, we will return to the Gospel according to John in which seeing means believing. To see, in John's gospel, is to know someone in a relational way. Jesus helps people to see, to know him and to know God in some new way.

Lent begins, however, in Matthew's gospel with the story of Jesus being tempted in the wilderness, after his baptism and before he begins his ministry. In this story it is Jesus who sees the truth of the human condition. We are all tempted or tested as Jesus was in that lonely time. We are temped to fend for ourselves, to seek power, and to align our allegiances to others who are not aligned with God's will for us. Before Jesus begins his journey to the cross, he is confronted with the human condition and stands against these forces that try to draw us away from our relationship with God.

Then we will turn to John's gospel. There **we will see God** through the eyes of Nicodemus the Pharisee who thought he knew God pretty well. Jesus helps us see that our relationship with God is deeper than the rituals and traditions we often cling to.

With the Samaritan woman at the well we will learn that **God sees us** for who we are and loves us, no matter what we have done or what others may think about us. Then, a man who was born blind will receive his sight. With him **we see the world around us** as well as the suspicion that is being cast upon Jesus. Finally, with the raising of Lazarus from the tomb, **we will see the promise of new life** and a preview of Christ's own resurrection.

Our experiences and assumptions can sometimes blind us from seeing God's amazing and surprising activity in the world around us. We live on this side of the Resurrection and that event can become so familiar that it is no longer amazing! Jesus longs to open our eyes and hearts to show us how loved we are by God, and helps us share this hope and promise for new life for everyone!

Whether you worship with us in person or remotely, I hope you will attend on Sundays this Lent as and the Holy Week services the first week of April. Come and see what you have been looking for! Jesus is ready to meet you in these eye-opening stories that bring us into deeper relationship with God and with God's people.

#### February Council Meeting February 14, 2023

#### Meeting called to order at 6:31pm, by Ken S.

Meeting opened with a prayer by Pastor Lynne. Separated into Boards at 6:36pm. Attendees reconvened for council meeting at 7:45pm.

#### Treasurer's Report (Chris K)

2023 financial summary based on bank statements. o January and YTD: Deposits = \$23,299; Payments = \$16,097; Difference of \$7202

#### Board of Trustees (Jack G)

The sanctuary remodel committee held their first meeting Sunday, with Terry Smith as chair. The committee will be working to collect ideas that can be presented for consideration at a future date.

The church will be looking for an individual to take over bookkeeping responsibilities. The hiring will be handled by Trustees.

Training for new counters will be happening on Sunday, February 19th after church.

There will be a new electronic security system installed at the church, SimpliSafe. Installation of the new system is starting this week. Training on the system will need take place for everyone who has a key to the church prior to activation.

The memorial fund committee is still in need of at least 1, preferably 2 individuals. If you or someone you know would like to be on this committee, please contact Jack.

In response to recent events, the synod has again asked churches to review their emergency action plans. Understanding of parishioners needs for safety in different situations is a priority for the synod. Pastor Lynne is part of the Battle Ground Pastors group and they will be having the Battle Ground Police Chief at an upcoming meeting where we may have other ideas to incorporate.

Annual staff reviews are scheduled for Tuesday, February 21.

The heat pump that handles the office area is being looked at by Tri-Tech Heating. There is a concern that was shared about it's capabilities to keep the office at a comfortable temperature when the outside conditions are extremely cold for an extended period of time.

#### Board of Education (Val M)

We are still in need of a volunteer to cover the nursery on the second Sunday. Having the TV to show the livestream has made it nice for anyone to go there to watch the service even if it is just for a bit of time while the child is fussy or being busy.

Frolic is the new Cradle Roll program that the church will be using. It will allow up to 5 individuals to be attached to a child's profile to receive updates along with parents.

Bags for the youth have been put together with activities and lessons for them to use during the Lenten season.

#### Board of Deacons (Erika S)

Shrove Tuesday, February 21, the men will be hosting a pancake dinner as we prepare to enter the Lenten season.

Easter is Sunday, April 9 this year. We will be having two services: one at 8:00am and one at 10:00am. The 10:00am service will be livestreamed. Between the two services there will be a continental Easter brunch.

Mallard Landing in Battle Ground is looking for Bethel members who are interested in participating in worship.

Our next ministry outreach program that we will be supporting is Lutheran Community Services NW (LCSNW). Noisy offering on April 30th will be donated to that organization.

Motion to add annual subscription for "ProPresenter" to improve tech options to the budget starting in 2024. This will replace PowerPoint as the software used for services. It adds more flexibility for the tech team, is more dynamic, and supports multi-screen displays. The initial subscription for 2023 of the software, and any additional hardware needed, will be donated. **MSA** 

Future outreach activities were discussed, including harvest days parade, craft night, trunk or treat, and other ideas. Revitalizing the KIT (Keep In Touch) program to connect with our on-line views and phone patch listeners.

#### Family Ministry Report (Bonnie)

The Souper Bowl of Caring event was a huge success. We collected 600 pounds of food and more than \$500 in financial contributions. These donations will be given to the North Clark County Food Bank.

A Lenten booklet is being put together that will include events and scriptures. Pick one up next week so you don't miss out.

Upcoming Pastor communications will include information about ELCA, Southwestern Washington Synod, and how congregations support and are supported by the denomination.


# **Community Outreach Ministries**


