Pastor's Page

On Saturday, June 4th, several of our Bethel members and I attended one of the Educational Gatherings held by the Southwestern Washington Synod of the ELCA. We gathered at Trinity Lutheran Church in Longview and began our time together with worship. We each attended two workshop and the keynote presentation from Joey Ager, Direction of Evangelical Mission for our synod. Below are some comments from those who attended.

The theme for the day was "Grow Together" to consider how we grow together as congregations, communities and society. Joey Ager has a background in community organizing and he helped us look at sacred encounters- with others, our selves, the land and God- as a foundational practice of being community together and of growing in new directions.



Workshop: Healing from the Legacy of Indian Boarding Schools—



The Orange Banner Project attended by Rick Hauser and Jim Fuerstenberg. The leaders, as well as a couple of the participants, outlined some of the horrendous treatment inflicted on native American children in boarding schools (many operated by churches) as late as the 1960s. The major aim was to "civilize" them by denying them their language, customs, and contact with their families. In a video one adult who had been taken from his family as a child described, as a consequence of that treatment, that he had been unable for 40 years to tell his wife that he loved her. It is disheartening to me that anyone with a clear understanding of God's love and grace could treat others in such a manner. This is a picture of a banner which churches are encouraged to

hang. Jim signed us up to receive a kit.

Workshop: Finding Resurrection in the Tomb

attended by Rick Hauser

This workshop concentrated on the Living Stones Prison Congregation at Shelton. When we were driving home, I heard that some of us have had some experience with that congregation of prison inmates. Currently, the congregation is shut down because of COVID. They're hoping to open up again in 4-6 months. I was impressed that this seemed to be more than an adjunct ministry within the prison, but an actual congregation supported by our synod.

Workshop: Faith Land Stewardship

attended by Jack Graves, Bonnie Stauffer, and Nancy Fuerstenberg

This session opened with a few representatives sharing their individual challenges with how to best utilize the "Land" assets of their respective churches. Some shared their outreach programs like tiny housing projects and Family Promise that address the increased number of houseless folks in their communities. Our Bethel participants came away feeling like we are making faithful use of our facilities, particularly with hosting RockSolid, Martial Arts, Boy Scouts, and the Community Gardens.

Speaker, Joey Ager asked the question, what is God's intention for this land?

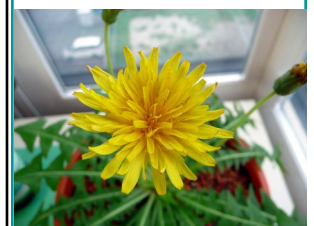

Bethel Lutheran Church Mission Statement

"We are called, enlightened and empowered through Christ
to worship, witness, and serve."

Pastor's message (contd)

He believes the Bible is very clear that God wants the land to represent 'Shalom', which means Love, well-being, wholeness, tranquility, harmony, peacefulness, etc. As inspiration for congregations, he invited us to reframe "property" to "land/earth", "ownership" to "stewardship", "scarcity" to "abundance", and "doing for" to "walking with." He then introduced a project generated by the Synod to help congregations develop, cherish and cultivate warm relationships with their immediate communities. The Synod partners with the congregation to lead them through a 6-month process that discerns cooperation with communities. He shared 4 steps used being: Listen, Learn (provide methodologies to achieve 'Shalom'), Action (doing things) and Reflection. He also emphasized that the Synod would "walk with" the congregation, rather than do things for the congregation.

Workshop: Cultivating Scriptural Imagination **attended by Jack Graves and Jim Fuerstenberg**

Rev. Rebecca Shjerven began by asking us each to share a favorite bible passage or story and why it was meaningful to us. From there she asked the question, how are people in the Bible real to us? She stressed that often 'we' are part of the story! Each story can mean many different things, or perhaps demonstrate more than one understanding depending on the perspective each person brings to it. After spending a considerable amount of time studying scripture with others, we may begin to see verses or stories that that have been used as weapons by many, and we may even find ourselves as the offender in a story. Pastor Shjerven shared a couple of websites we could visit to learn to study the bible using Ignatian Contemplation and Visio Divina, using art in prayer and meditation, which we were able to practice together.

Workshop: All Creation Sings **attended by Nancy Fuerstenberg and Pastor Lynne**

"All Creation Sings" is the newest hymnal published to follow Evangelical Lutheran Worship (the red hymnal in our pews). Its primary focus is on hymns that promote care for creation, but there are also many new and revised hymns. Some have familiar tunes with new lyrics, others are songs that are more recently published, and several come out of cultures from around the world. It also includes two new liturgy settings. We were able to sing through some of the songs and we would like to buy enough copies for the praise team and the accompaniment edition for Bethel.

Workshop: I Love to Tell the Story *attended by Pastor Lynne (Books have been ordered by a congregation member and will be donated to Bethel when them arrive).* This workshop outlined the basics of applying for grants to support the vision and mission of the church. When applying for funding it is important to tell the stories that illustrate how a given program changes or could change the lives of those who are served. Congregations often apply for grants to support programs that feed the hungry, care for children and youth, or create space for other community outreach programs.

Workshop: Growing Young to Grow Together **attended by Bonnie Stauffer**

The speaker shared a book he recommended for children and youth workers to read called, Growing Young: 6 Essential Strategies to Help Young People Discover and Love Your Church, by Kara Powell, Jake Mulder, and Brad Griffin. He opened the discussion up to let everyone share the type of events they do for the children and youth in their congregations.

June Council Meeting
June 14, 2022

Meeting called to order at 6:32pm, by Jack.

Meeting opened with a prayer by Pastor Lynne. Jack read our council mission statement and there was discussion about how the council mission statement is working in our lives.

Suggestion from congregation to investigate updating the sitting area outside the office. Will be investigated by appropriate board / teams.

Separated into Boards at 6:50pm.

Attendees reconvened for council meeting at 7:45pm.

Treasurer's Report (Chris)

April is the last month that has been reviewed as Riverview Bank does not have statements available due to a system issue. April statement review: Deposits \$28,954 and Expenses \$20,484 for positive cash flow of \$8470.

Going to be working to put together a Financial Policies and Procedures manual for the church. This would encompass all aspects of the financial system (counting / bookkeeping / reporting).

Board of Trustees (Jack G)

Awaiting final permit from the county for heat pump installation. Current ETA of equipment is mid to late June.

Chad hoping to have draft of emergency manual available in July. Chris will be connecting with Rob M about possibility of doing AED training / refresher.

Discussion and planning around the stewardship program is underway. Looking at doing a program that is more of a year-round program with quarterly updates that incorporates our outreach and stewardship along with giving reports. Chad is going to be working with Pastor Lynne to get letters prepared that highlight how giving impacts worship and our commitment to God to send with these quarterly communications. Targeting September as first update.

Need to find additional Tellers / Counters to get trained and be able to assist with this activity on Tuesdays.

Board of Deacons (Candi)

Jan Saylor held the VP position on the Board of Deacons, and her sudden passing has left a vacancy on the board. The Deacons will be reaching out to the nominating committee to see if they can find a member of the congregation to fill the remainder of Jan's term on the board.

Finalized plans to have the processional style of communion the first Sunday in July and August. To minimize health risks, the elements will be served by presenting the wafers and handing out individual cups to recipients. We will continue to use the packaged elements for communion on the other Sundays of the months.



Father's Day activities are planned for Sunday, June 19th,. Young volunteers will be assisting Erika to pass out gifts to honor the men of the congregation.

The deacons were asked to consider a time change for summer worship, possibly holding the service at an earlier time. It was determined there is not sufficient time to make a change this year. The deacons will look at this possibility next year to allow for proper planning.

Dean and Judy Sutera will be opening their home again to the congregation on Sunday, August 21 for the annual church potluck gathering. Details will follow in the coming weeks.

There are no plans for a Rally Day picnic at Lewisville Park this year.

Plans are in the works for an advertised event in September when Bethel will invite the community to meet Pastor Lynne and give her an opportunity to share with others about her trip to the Holy Land.

Pastor Lynne received communication from Lasana Kanneh, a musician from West Africa who has performed previously at Bethel with an acapella choir. He is now based locally and asked about performing again at Bethel. Dates being considered are August 21 or 28.

Board of Education (Linda B)

In an effort to get better coverage for the nursery Val did some checking into other options. Care.com was one suggestion, but it was too complicated and costly for our needs. She contacted other churches in the area to see what they did for their nursery coverage, and all of them said it was staffed by volunteers. Need to continue recruiting individuals who would volunteer to help with the nursery on Sundays. All volunteers need to be background checked and current policy requires volunteers between 12-18 years of age to have an adult with them in the nursery as well.

One suggestion was to add a 'Smart' TV to the nursery so the service could be broadcast in there. That way the nursery attendant could hear and see parts of the service real time. Also, if there were children that could participate in the Children's Message during the service, the attendant might be able to bring them over if they knew when that portion of the service was happening.

Family Ministry Report (Bonnie)

Graduation recognition and celebration for Aiden DeBrock was held on Sunday, June 5th.

VBS will be held June 27 – 30, from 9am-12pm. The Thrivent Work Party event brought together volunteers young and old to help put together the props and decorations for the week. Overall the work party went well, and some additional ideas were collected for future events we might host like that. Last minute preparations are now under way for this community event. Finalizing the presentation / video portions, the opening / closing for each day, and getting ready to welcome the kids on June 27!

Pastor's Report (Pr. Lynne)

Pastor Lynne and 5 other members of the congregation recently attended a regional synod workshop at Trinity Lutheran Church in Longview. Summaries from all who attended will be included in the Bethel Bell.

Closing (Jack)

Next meeting will be July 12th.

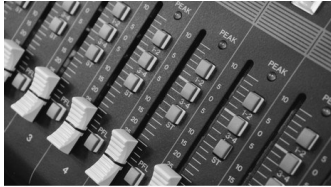
