And I know that it's the spirit of the Lord!

We have had a number of visitors come through our doors over the past several weeks. Some have been invited by our congregation. like our quest musician Lasana Kenneh and his wife. Others were travelers who found us on our website. And some visitors have been invited by some of you!

Consistently I have received similar comments from these newcomers saving they sensed a warm and welcoming presence here. I think that's something to be proud of! When we talk about the future of the church—and our congregation particularly—we can often become discouraged. We have had a lot of funerals this year. Some of our elders and those with health concerns are no longer gathering with us. We would love to have more young people.

The number one way to attract new people to our congregation is by inviting people to come and experience this warm, welcoming spirit that we have all come to love and cherish. Sometimes it takes more than one invitation. We don't need to be pushy, but simply keeping the door open to come with us may be the gentle nudge that will eventually help someone say yes.

Sometimes it's helpful to invite others to something other than worship. Several people invited friends to the Holy Land presentation last month. Our Keenagers (that "keen" group of folks who aren't tied to work anymore) will be holding their first social gathering since before the pandemic. (See page 8)

We also have the return of the church bazaar this month, and the Thanksgiving dinner is coming up in November. Our BLCW brunches and Men's breakfasts are other easy events to invite your friends and neighbors to come to and see who we are.

Knowing that recent visitors have had a good experience may encourage us to extend those invitations to others that we intend to make but can sometimes feel shy about.

And if you meet someone new some Sunday morning, feel free to offer them a "Welcome Home" packet that tells a little more about Bethel. You can find them on the Welcome desk in the narthex. When we extend an invitation to our family, friends, and neighbors, we are really extending the love of God to them, because that spirit of warmth and welcome our visitors have experienced here is the Spirit of God who calls and gathers us into the Body of Christ.

September Council Meeting September 13, 2022

Meeting called to order at 6:31pm, by Ken S.

Meeting opened with a prayer by Pastor Lynne. Ken read our council mission statement.

Ken shared that the chairs in the entry of the narthex have been replaced. These chairs were purchased using Memorial Fund donations from Jan Sayler's family, coordinated by Candi E., Val M, and the deacons. The new seating area has already been enjoyed by church visitors. The old chairs are available to a good home, free delivery is available if needed. If they don't find a home within our church family, we will be donating them to an organization that supports a mission that fits with Bethel's – such as the NW Furniture Bank.

Separated into Boards at 6:40pm.

Attendees reconvened for council meeting at 8:00pm.

Treasurer's Report (Chris)

Financial summary based on bank statements.

- August: Deposits \$27,246, Payments \$20,856, Difference \$6,390
- YTD**: Deposits \$243,305, Payments \$257,305, Difference \$-14,022
 **YTD summary includes the expenses related to new heating / cooling system

Board VPs received a summary of expenses to review from Chris. We will be reviewing how some expenses are reported to ensure that pass through money from memorial funds and honorariums are applied correctly. In addition, which items are coded to certain categories are correct for the expense.

Budget planning sessions for 2023 are being planned. Be thinking about you might need for next year so we can have a good plan in place to present at the annual meeting in December.

Board of Trustees (Jack G)

The Trustees have approved extending an offer of \$500/month to a choir director, who will lead vocal and handbell choirs. Initially the focus will be on choir, and handbells to be added later.

Urgent need to find additional counters. In order to expand the possible individuals to perform the task, we are asking the team to start counting on Sundays. This will hopefully help to train people and find individuals who might not be able to help on Tuesdays. Ken and other council officers will make an ask at upcoming services to hopefully find volunteers to fill this important role.

Annual budget planning is being discussed as Chris shared. Planning to meet with other VPs to work on budget for 2023. Also want to put together an equipment list to identify future replacement needs for these important (and usually critical) devices.

Chad has worked with Pastor Lynne, Jack, and others to prepare a stewardship kickoff letter to send to members along with a giving statement. They are planning to send out by the end of September.

Board of Deacons (Candi)

Choir practices are scheduled to start on Wednesday, October 5 at 6:30. We will not be having any additional gathering or worship activities on Wednesdays just yet, but plans are being discussed with further updates at a future council meeting.

The Holy Land presentation by Pastor Lynne and Eric will take place this Sunday, 9/18. The community has been invited to attend and snacks that highlight foods of the region will be shared.

This year marks 20 years that RockSolid has been supporting youth in our community. We will be celebrating this ministry and exciting milestone on September 25th. Pastor Lynne and Marcy will have a 'conversational sermon' to discuss the ministry work that RockSolid does, and all are invited to enjoy cake following the service.

The Bethel Bazaar is scheduled for October 29. Soup and muffins will be offered by the deacons, but there will not be a bake sale and vendors will not be allowed to sell food items. Both of the quilting groups will be raffling off quilts to support their ministry work. Proceeds from the bazaar will be used to restripe the parking lot.

A Halloween event is being planned for October 27 at noon. Costumes are optional and all are invited to attend. Thanksgiving dinner is planned for 11/20 following service.

Candi put together a survey to obtain congregants' input about Bethel's ministries. She will be incorporating input she has received and will be leaving out on tables and the entry desk in the narthex. Hopefully a direct approach to encourage members to fill out the survey will increase participation and response.

Board of Education (Linda B)

The nursery coverage plan is close to be finalized. There will be a list of who is scheduled to cover each Sunday posted. Ushers and greeters should share with members and guests who have young children that the nursery is available during worship if needed.

Education classes for adults and youth are scheduled to start this Sunday – 9/18. To help the youth connect more with their giving, they will be provided with their own 'bank' to collect change in. On noisy offering Sundays they will be encouraged to share their 'tithes' with the ministry that we are supporting that week. The first ministry that will be supported with the youth participation will be RockSolid.

Pastor's Report (Pr. Lynne)

Pastor Lynne shared that we have seen many visitors over the last few months. She has heard from many who shared that 'a warm spirit is felt here'. They all feel welcome and enjoy our congregation.

We will be placing Visitor Cards in the pews and encouraging visitors to fill these out so we can connect with them following their visit.


